

### Care & cleaning

- Before you lift or reposition your monitor, it is better to disconnect the cables and power cord. Follow the correct lifting techniques when positioning the monitor. When lifting or carrying the monitor, grasp the edges of the monitor. Do not lift the display by the stand or the cord.
- Cleaning. Turn your monitor off and unplug the power cord. Clean the monitor surface with a lint-free, non-abrasive cloth. Stubborn stains may be removed with a cloth dampened with mild cleaner.
- Avoid using a cleaner containing alcohol or acetone. Use a cleaner intended for use with the LCD. Never spray cleaner directly on the screen, as it may drip inside the monitor and cause an electric shock.

#### The following symptoms are normal with the monitor:

- You may find slightly uneven brightness on the screen depending on the desktop pattern you use.
- When the same image is displayed for hours, an afterimage of the previous screen may remain after switching the image. The screen will recover slowly or you can turn off the Power Switch for hours.
- When the screen becomes black or flashes, or cannot work anymore, contact your dealer or service center to fix it. Do not repair the screen by yourself!






#### 1.3.2 Back view



- 1. Controls button. For more information, refer to page 1-3.
- 2. AC-IN port. This port connects the power cord.
- 3. **HDMI port**. This port is for connection with an HDMI compatible device.
- 4. VGA port. This port is for connection with a VGA compatible device.
- Earphone jack. This port is only available when an HDMI cable is connected.
- 6. Kensington lock slot.

#### 1.3.3 Using the Controls button

Use the control button  ${\color{red} \pmb{\circlearrowleft}}$  on the back of the monitor to adjust the image settings.



#### Central button:

Press this button to enter the OSD menu.

#### 2. Left key:

Exit the OSD menu or return to the previous layer.

#### 3. Right key:

- Power Off shortcut key.
- Enter the option of the next layer.

#### 4. Up key:

- Brightness shortcut key.
- Move the option upwards or increase the option value.

#### 5. Down key:

- Energy Saving shortcut key:
- Move the option downwards or decrease the option value.
- Key Lock shortcut key. Press and hold it for 5 seconds to enable/disable Keys Lock.




You can press the controls button in any 5 directions to turn on the monitor.

### 2.1 Assembling the monitor arm/base

To assemble the monitor base:

- Carefully place the monitor on the EPS foam, with the screen facing down.
- 2. Attach the base to the arm.
- 3. Lift the screw ring and turn it clockwise to secure the base.
- Remove the stand cover.
- Place the arm hinge of the the stand assembly onto its compartment on the rear of the monitor. Then use the L-shaped screwdriver to secure it with four screws.
- 6. Install the stand cover to the rear of the monitor.





Base screw size: M6 x 12 mm.



Hinge screw size: M4 x 10 mm.

### 2.2 Adjusting the monitor

- For optimal viewing, we recommend that you look at the full face of the monitor, then adjust the monitor to the angle that is most comfortable for you.
- Hold the stand to prevent the monitor from falling when you change its angle.
- The recommended adjusting angle is + 23° to -5°.






It is normal that the monitor slightly shakes while you adjust the viewing angle.

### 2.3 Detaching the base (for VESA wall mount)

The detachable arm/base of this monitor is specially designed for VESA wall mount.

#### To detach the arm/base:

- 1. Disconnect power and signal cables. Carefully place the monitor on the EPS foam, with the screen facing down.
- Remove the stand cover.
- 3. Use the L-shaped screwdriver to remove the four screws. Then remove the stand assembly.
- 4. Remove the four rubber pads. Then align and install the wall mount bracket on the rear of the monitor.





- We recommend that you cover the table surface with soft cloth to prevent damage to the monitor.
- · Hold the base while removing the screw.




- The VESA wall mount kit (100 x 100 mm) is purchased separately.
- Use only the UL Listed Wall Mount Bracket with minimum weight/load 22.7kg (Screw size: M4 x 10 mm).

### 2.4 Connecting the cables

Connect the cables as the following instructions:



- To connect the power cord: Connect one end of the power cord securely to the monitor's AC input port, the other end to a power outlet.
- To connect the HDMI cable:
  - a. Plug one end of the HDMI cable to the monitor's HDMI port.
  - Connect the other end of the HDMI cable to your computer's HDMI port.
- To connect the VGA cable:
  - Plug one end of the VGA cable to the monitor's VGA port and secure the cable head to the monitor.
  - Connect the other end of the VGA cable to your computer's VGA port and secure the cable head to your computer.
- To use the earphone: Connect the end with plug type to the monitor's earphone jack when an HDMI signal is fed.





### 2.5 Turning on the monitor

Press the Controls button in any of the 5 directions to turn on the monitor. See page 1-2 for the location of the controls button. The power indicator lights up in white to show that the monitor is ON.

### 3.1 OSD (On-Screen Display) menu

### 3.1.1 How to reconfigure




- Press the Controls button in any of the 5 directions to display the OSD menu.
- 2. Press the Central button to activate the OSD menu.
- 3. Press the Up or Down key to toggle between options in the menu. As you move from one icon to another, the option name is highlighted.
- 4. To select the highlighted item in the menu, press the Central button or the Right key.
- 5. Press the Up or Down key to select the desired parameter.
- 6. Press the Central button or the Right key to enter the adjustment mode and then use the Up or Down key based on the indicators in the menu, to make your changes.

#### 3.1.2 OSD function introduction

#### 1. Splendid

This function contains eight sub-functions that you can select for your preference.



 Standard Mode: Best choice for document editing with Splendid Video Enhancement.



Standard Mode meets Energy Star® requirements.

- sRGB Mode: Best choice for viewing photos and graphics from PCs.
- Scenery mode: Best choice for scenery photo displaying with Splendid Video Enhancement.
- Theater Mode: Best choice for movie watching with Splendid Video Enhancement.
- Game Mode: Best choice for game playing with Splendid Video Enhancement. For ultimate gaming experience, set the refresh rate to 120Hz (overclocking).
- Night View Mode: Best choice for playing dark-scene game or watching dark-scene movie with Splendid Video Enhancement.
- Reading Mode: Best choice for book reading.
- Darkroom Mode: Best choice for a weak ambient light environment.



- In the Standard mode, the following function(s) are not user-configurable: Saturation and ASCR.
- In the sRGB mode, the following function(s) are not user-configurable:
   Brightness, Contrast, Saturation, Color Temp., ASCR, and Color Augmentation.
- In the Reading mode, the following function(s) are not user-configurable:
   Contrast, Saturation, Color Temp., and ASCR.
- ASUS DisplayWidget Center: Scan the QR code and download the custom-built app for ASUS monitors that allows you to control monitor settings such as brightness, contrast, and color temperature, all with just a few clicks of your mouse.



#### 2. Eye Care

In this function, you can adjust settings to better protect your eyes.



- Blue Light Filter: In this function, you can adjust the blue light filter from 0 to max.
  - 0: No changes.

Max: The higher the level, the less blue light is scattered.
 When blue light filter is activated, the default settings of
 Standard Mode will be automatically imported. Besides
 maximum level, the brightness is user-configurable.
 Maximum is the optimized setting. It is compliance with TUV
 low blue light certification\*. The brightness function is not
 user configurable.



\*When color augmentation is in default value (50).



Please refer to the following to alleviate eye strains:

- Users should take some time away from the display if working for long hours: It is advised to take short breaks (at least 5 mins) after around 1 hour of continuous working at the computer. Taking short and frequent breaks is more effective than a single longer break.
- To minimize eye strain and dryness in your eyes, users should rest the eye periodically by focusing on objects that are far away.
- Eye exercises can help to reduce eye strain. Repeat these
  exercises often. If eye strain continues, please contact a
  physician. Eye exercises: (1) Repeating look up and down (2)
  Slowly roll your eyes (3) Move your eyes diagonal.
- High energy blue light may lead to eye strain and AMD(Age-Related Macular Degeneration). Blue light Filter reduces 70% (max.) harmful blue light to avoid CVS(Computer Vision Syndrome) when the user adjusts the blue light filter bar to the maximum level.
- Rest Reminder: This function provides you a rest reminder according to how long you set for your working time. For example, if you set a 30-minute working time and there will be a pop up reminder appeared on the upper left corner of the monitor for 5 seconds when time is up. Press any key to make this reminder OSD disappear.



When this function is enabled, the following functions are not available: GamePlus and QuickFit

 Color Augmentation: The adjusting range of color enhancement is from 0 to 100.



This function is not available in sRGB mode in the Splendid menu.

#### 3. Color

Set a desired color setting from this menu.




- **Brightness**: The adjusting range is from 0 to 100.
- Contrast: The adjusting range is from 0 to 100.
- Saturation: The adjusting range is from 0 to 100.
- Color Temp.: Contains 4 modes including Cool, Normal, Warm and User Mode.



In the User Mode, colors of R (Red), G (Green), and B (Blue) are user-configurable; the adjusting range is from 0 to 100.

#### 4. Image

Set the image related setting from this menu.



- Sharpness: The adjusting range is from 0 to 100.
- **Trace Free**: Adjusts the response time of the monitor.
- Aspect Control: Adjusts the aspect ratio to Full or 1:1 Ratio.
- ASCR: Turns on/off the ASCR (ASUS Smart Contrast Ratio) function.
- Motion Sync: Offers a more clear mode while displaying motion pictures. Please note this function only works when the refresh rate is 75Hz ~ 120Hz. It includes two modes: Normal Mode and Advanced Mode, which can provide different effects.



- When this function is enabled, the system will automatically reduce the brightness level.
- If the Adaptive Sync is enabled, the Motion Sync function is grayed out.
- Adaptive Sync: Allows an Adaptive Sync supported graphics source to dynamically adjust display refresh rate based on typical content frame rates for power efficient, virtually stutter free and low-latency display update.



This function is not available when Motion Sync is enabled.

- Position: Adjust the horizontal position (H-Position) and the vertical position (V-Position) of the image. The adjusting range is from 0 to 100 (only available for VGA input).
- Focus: Reduce the Horizontal-line noise and Vertical-line noise of the image by adjusting (Phase) and (Clock) separately. The adjusting range is from 0 to 100 (only available for VGA input).
- Auto Adjust.: Automatically adjusts the image to its optimized position, clock, and phase. (Only available for VGA input.)

#### 5. Signal

Select the input source.



#### 6. Settings

Allows you to adjust the system.



- Volume: Adjusts the volume level.
- GamePlus: The GamePlus function provides a toolkit and creates a better gaming environment for users when playing different types of games.

- Crosshair: The crosshair overlay with different crosshair options lets you choose the one that best suits the game you're playing.
- Timer: You can position the timer on the upper left corner of the display so you can keep track of the gaming time.
- FPS Counter: The FPS (frames per second) counter lets you know how smooth the game is running.
- **Display Alignment**: Display Alignment displays alignment lines on 4 sides of the screen, serving as an easy and handy tool for you to line up multiple monitors perfectly.
- QuickFit: You can have a preview of the document or photo layout directly on screen without printing test copies.
  - Alignment: This facilitates designers and users to organize content and layout on one page and achieve a consistent look and feel.





 Power Saving: Reduces power consumption. The default setting is Deep Level. When Deep Level is selected, the maximum brightness value is fixed and Splendid mode is fixed at Standard Mode.

#### OSD Setup:

- OSD Timeout: Adjusts the OSD timeout from 10 to 120 seconds.
- **DDC/CI**: Enables or disables the DDC/CI function.
- Transparency: Adjusts the OSD background from opaque to transparent.
- Language: There are 23 languages for your selection, including English, French, German, Spanish, Italian, Dutch, Russian, Polish, Czech, Croatian, Hungarian, Romanian, Portuguese, Turkish, Simplified Chinese, Traditional Chinese, Japanese, Korean, Persian, Thai, Indonesian, Ukrainian, and Vietnamese.
- Key Lock: To disable all function keys. Press the Down key for over 5 seconds to cancel the key lock function.
- **Information**: Shows the monitor information.
- Power Indicator: Turns the power LED indicator on/off.
- **Power Key Lock**: Enables or disables the power key.
- All Reset: "Yes" allows you to restore the default settings.

#### 7. Shortcut

Defines the functions for Shortcut 1 and 2 buttons.



- Shortcut 1: User can select from "Blue Light Filter", "Splendid",
   "Brightness", "Contrast", "Color Temp.", "Volume", "GamePlus",
   "Quick Fit", "Rest Reminder", "Color Augmentation", "Energy Saving"
   and set as shortcut key. The default setting is Brightness.
- Shortcut 2: User can select from "Blue Light Filter", "Splendid",
   "Brightness", "Contrast", "Color Temp.", "Volume", "GamePlus",
   "Quick Fit", "Rest Reminder", "Color Augmentation", "Energy Saving"
   and set as shortcut key. The default setting is Energy Saving.


