



#### Power management modes





#### Cleaning your monitor

For best practices, follow the instructions in the list below while unpacking, cleaning or handling your monitor:

- To clean your screen, lightly dampen a soft, clean cloth with water. If possible, use a special screen-cleaning tissue or solution suitable for the antistatic coating. Do not use benzene, thinner, ammonia, abrasive cleaners or compressed air.
- Use a lightly-dampened cloth to clean the monitor. Avoid using detergent of any kind as some detergents leave a milky film on the monitor.
- If you notice white powder when you unpack your monitor, wipe it off with a cloth.
- Handle your monitor with care as the black-colored monitor may get scratched and show white scuff marks
- To help maintain the best image quality on your monitor, use a dynamically changing screen saver and turn Off your monitor when not in use.



To attach the monitor stand:


1. Place the monitor on a soft cloth or cushion



2. Fit the stand riser and stand base together, and then turn the screw in the stand base.



**3.** Fit the two tabs on the upper part of the stand to the groove on the back of the monitor. Press the stand until it snaps into place.



**4.** Inserting the stand until the snap locked.





1. Place the monitor on a soft cloth or cushion along the desk.




2. Tilt the stand downwards to access to the release button.



To set the maximum resolution for the monitor:

- **1.** For Windows 8 and Windows 8.1, select the Desktop tile to switch to classic desktop.
- 2. Right-click on the desktop and click **Screen Resolution**.
- 3. Click the Dropdown list of the Screen Resolution and select 1920 x 1080.
- 4. Click OK

If you do not see  $1920 \times 1080$  as an option, you may need to update your graphics driver. Depending on your computer, complete one of the following procedures:

If you have a Dell desktop or portable computer:


**WARNING:** Before you begin any of the procedures in this section, follow the Safety Instructions.

#### Self-Test

Your monitor provides a self-test feature that allows you to check if your monitor is functioning properly. If your monitor and computer are properly connected but the monitor screen remains dark, run the monitor self-test by performing the following steps:

- **1.** Turn off both your computer and the monitor.
- 2. Disconnect all video cables from the monitor. This way, the computer doesn't have to be involved.
- **3**. Turn on the monitor

If the monitor is working correctly, it detects that there is no signal and one of the following message appears. While in self-test mode, the power LED remains white.





- **NOTE:** This box also appears during normal system operation, if the video cable is disconnected or damaged.
  - 4. Turn Off your monitor and reconnect the video cable; then turn on your computer and the monitor.


If your monitor remains dark after you reconnect the cables, check your video controller and computer.

#### **Built-in diagnostics**

Your monitor has a built-in diagnostic tool that helps you determine if any screen abnormality you experience is an inherent problem with your monitor, or with your computer and video card.



**NOTE:** You can run the built-in diagnostics only when the video cable is unplugged and the monitor is in self-test mode.



To run the built-in diagnostics:

- 1. Ensure that the screen is clean (no dust particles on the surface of the screen).
- 2. Unplug the video cable(s) from the back of the computer or monitor. The monitor then goes into the self-test mode.
- **3.** Press and hold Button 1 for 5 seconds. A gray screen appears.
- 4. Carefully inspect the screen for abnormalities.
- **5.** Press Button 1 on the bottom of the monitor again. The color of the screen changes to red.
- 6. Inspect the display for any abnormalities.
- 7. Repeat steps 5 and 6 to inspect the display in green, blue, black, white and text screens.

The test is complete when the text screen appears. To exit, press Button 1 again.

If you do not detect any screen abnormalities upon using the built-in diagnostic tool, the monitor is functioning properly. Check the video card and computer.

Poor Focus	<ul> <li>Eliminate video extension cables.</li> <li>Reset the monitor to Factory Settings (Factory Reset).</li> <li>Change the video resolution to the correct aspect ratio.</li> </ul>	
Shaky/Jittery Video	<ul> <li>Reset the monitor to Factory Settings (Factory Reset).</li> <li>Check environmental factors.</li> <li>Relocate the monitor and test in another room.</li> </ul>	
Missing Pixels	<ul> <li>Cycle power On-Off.</li> <li>Pixel that is permanently Off is a natural defect that can occur in LCD technology.</li> <li>For more information on Dell Monitor Quality and Pixel Policy, see Dell Support site at:         <ul> <li>www.dell.com/support/monitors.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>

Safety Related Issues	<ul><li>Do not perform any troubleshooting steps.</li><li>Contact Dell immediately.</li></ul>
Intermittent Problems	<ul> <li>Ensure that the video cable connecting the monitor to the computer is connected properly and is secure.</li> <li>Reset the monitor to Factory Settings (Factory Reset).</li> <li>Perform monitor self-test feature check to determine if the intermittent problem occurs in self-test mode.</li> </ul>

Wrong Color	<ul> <li>Change the Color Setting Mode in the Color Settings OSD to Graphics or Video depending on the application.</li> <li>Try different Preset Modes in Color settings OSD. Adjust R/G/B value in Custom Color in Color settings OSD.</li> <li>Change the Input Color Format to RGB or YPbPr in the Color settings OSD.</li> <li>Run the built-in diagnostics.</li> </ul>
Image retention from a static image left on the monitor for a long period of time	<ul> <li>Use the Power Management feature to turn off the monitor at all times when not in use (for more information, see Power management modes).</li> <li>Alternatively, use a dynamically changing screensaver.</li> </ul>
Video Ghosting or Overshooting	Change the <b>Response Time</b> in the <b>Display</b> OSD to <b>Fast</b> or <b>Norm</b> depending on your application and usage.

If yes, press and hold the menu button for 10 seconds to unlock. (For more information, see Lock).</li> </ul>	
No Input Signal when user controls are pressed	<ul> <li>Check the signal source. Ensure the computer is not in standby or sleep mode by moving the mouse or pressing any key on the keyboard.</li> <li>Check if the video cable is plugged in properly. Disconnect and reconnect the video cable if necessary.</li> <li>Reset the computer or video player.</li> </ul>	
The picture does not fill the entire screen	<ul> <li>Due to different video formats (aspect ratio) of DVDs, the monitor may display in full screen.</li> <li>Run the built-in diagnostics.</li> </ul>
